Results of 36th Annual San Joaquin County Academic Decathlon Announced

Tracy High School takes first place, overall, in competition that drew teams from 12 county high schools

More than 350 students from 12 high schools in San Joaquin County took part in the 36th Annual Academic Decathlon hosted by the San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE). The competition began with students engaging in speech and interview contests at the SJCOE on Jan. 28. On Feb. 4, the competition moved to Lathrop High School, where competitors showcased their knowledge of art, economics, literature, mathematics, music, science, and social science in a series of tests, culminating in the high-energy Super Quiz. Each year, all the decathlon events are tied together with a single theme. This year, the theme was World War II.

Schools can field multiple teams, but only one Division I team can compete from each school. Each nine-member team consists of three students in each of three categories, based on grade point average: Honors (3.75 - 4.0+), Scholastic (3.0 - 3.74), and Varsity (0.0 - 2.99).
