The San Joaquin County Office of Education's Greater Valley Conservation Corps (GVCC) held its first Recognition Lunch on Oct. 24 to highlight the hard work of the members of the corps as well as the clients and partners who helped the program grow as it makes San Joaquin County and the surrounding region a cleaner, greener place to be.

At the event GVCC Crew Lead Ruben Colin Guzman shared how the GVCC helped him improve his life. Once a high school dropout, Guzman first joined the GVCC as a corpsmember in 2012 while completing his high school education at Building Futures Academy, a charter school run by the San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE). During his time at GVCC he said that he worked hard to finally be hired as a crew lead, even though it didn't happen the first time he applied for the job.

"In my time here I've met great people from different backgrounds and have seen first-hand the positive impact that our organization has made in the lives of these individuals, as well as the impact it made on mine and our community. This makes me proud to say: I'm Ruben and I'm a crew lead for the Greater Valley Conservation Corps," Guzman said.

Held at the SJCOE's Wentworth Education Center, the lunch brought together dozens of supporters of the GVCC who applauded the awardees as they received their plaques.
