What's Math Got To Do With It?

Jo Boaler is a Professor of Mathematics Education at Stanford University, and co-founder of Youcubed, a non-profit organization that provides mathematics education resources to parents and educators. Her PhD won the national award for educational research in the UK and her book: *Experiencing School Mathematics*, won the 'Outstanding Book Of the Year' award for education in Britain. She is the author of seven books including, *What's Math Got To Do With It?* (2009) and *The Elephant in the Classroom* (2010), both written for teachers and parents with the goal of improving mathematics education. Participants will explore new research ideas on mathematics learning and student mindsets that can transform students' experiences with math.

This full day with Jo Boaler will be followed by one day of *Cognitively Guided Instruction* (CGI) which is an approach to teaching mathematics with promising practices to implement Common Core State Standards in the classroom. This second day will be broken into different content areas and will be facilitated by the developers of CGI. This approach has a potential for shifting and transforming instruction to better prepare students for the 21st Century.
