Catherine Ettle Named San Joaquin County Teacher of the Year

Lincoln Unified School District music teacher moves forward as California Teacher of the Year finalist

The San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE) is excited to announce that Lincoln Unified School District (LUSD) teacher Catherine Ettle has been named the 2018 San Joaquin County Teacher of the Year. The surprise announcement was the culminating moment at the Eighth Annual San Joaquin County Classified Employee and Teacher of the Year Awards Celebration Dinner held at the SJCOE on Thursday, June 7.

She pushes us past our self-conceived limits and finds or creates new opportunities for us to grow as musicians and people. Above all, she is a friend who will always be there for any of her students, ready and willing to help them deal with any of the challenges that life dishes out. She is one of those teachers that they make movies about.
