### **Harnessing the Power of Student Motivation Using Pivotal Response Teaching in Speech Therapy**

As rates of autism continue to rise, it has become increasingly important for school-based providers to utilize evidence-based practices (EBP) in addressing the developmental challenges seen across the autism spectrum. One such EBP is Pivotal Response Teaching (PRT). Rooted in both developmental and behavioral principles, PRT specifies teacher behaviors that are designed to get and maintain a high level of student motivation, as well as maintain and generalize student skills across a variety of settings and people.

#### Speaker: Janice Chan, M.A., BCBA

Janice Chan, M.A., BCBA, a former moderate/severe teacher, is the Classroom Pivotal Response Teaching (CPRT) lead trainer. She oversees the development of CPRT training materials, trains other research staff in the CPRT training protocol, and provides CPRT training for research participants. In addition to research work, she is an adjunct professor at San Diego State University, serves on the board of directors of Banding Together and Miracle 139 International, and coordinates a respite program at her church.
