#### Teacher of the Year Nominations Due April 23, 2021

The Teacher of the Year Program is open to all teachers that teach Pre-kindergarten through Grade 12. Each district, through their Superintendent's office, may submit up to three candidates to SJCOE for consideration, consisting of one candidate from each grade span. Grade spans are delineated as Pre-K to Grade 5; Grades 6 through 8; and Grades 9 through 12. Each district may devise its own application and selection process to determine their candidates.

The California Department of Education requires that each candidate have a minimum of 8 years classroom teaching experience. Also, candidates cannot be retiring at the end of the 2021-2022 academic year.

Premier Community Credit Union will award four finalists with \$400 and the County Teacher of the Year will be awarded \$1000. The County Teacher of the Year and the four finalists will be honored at an awards event. The date and location is to be determined.

In the application teachers are asked to complete one cover letter form (<u>click here to download the application</u>), one nomination form which addresses three of the Standards for the Teaching Profession and provide two letters of support.
