The Families in Transition (FIT) team has successfully collected over 300 food items this year to assist youth and families who are experiencing homelessness. The Food Drive event, which was coordinated by the FIT team, involved the distribution of drop-off sites at SJCOE. Generous donations included nonperishable food, dry goods, canned vegetables, fruits, proteins, pasta, and rice to supply the pantry. The food pantry serves as an emergency resource for homeless students throughout the County. Additionally, transition specialists also provide resources to different emergency food bank locations to support these individuals in the long term.
