

Ms. Weber has twentythree years of experience working with a developmentally disabled child, following her son's diagnosis at age 3 of "autistic like syndrome." She has two Master's Degrees and a PhD in Organizational Psychology. A published author, Ms. Weber has spoken to a variety of groups as a presenter and guest lecturer. She is involved in supporting Special Olympics and is a member of numerous scholastic and professional associations.

Mr. Weber graduated from California Western School of Law in December 2014 with a Juris Doctorate and passed the Bar Exam in 2015. Now a licensed California attorney, he advocates for students with special needs and their parents. He attends IEP meetings, reviews IEPs and other educational documents, conducts legal research, and informs parents of their substantive and procedural special education rights. Mr. Weber is a published author and an accomplished motivational speaker. He speaks to students. families and professionals, sharing his knowledge and experience on living with Autism, strategies for students entering post-secondary education and vocational training, Special Olympics, and improving group homes.
