Stockton Historical Maritime Museum and San Joaquin Building Futures Academy students restore and revitalize USS LUCID MSO 458

## **BACKGROUND**

Stockton Historical Maritime Museum was established in 2010 to celebrate the cultural heritage and history of the downtown Stockton waterfront. After nearly two years of existence, SHMM acquired the former USS LUCID MSO 458, an Aggressive Class oceangoing minesweeper and true sister ship of three vessels built for the US Navy in Stockton at the Colberg Boat Works in the early 1950's. Built in 1953 by Higgins in New Orleans, LA; she served her country for more than 20 years until decommissioned in 1976.

In 2011, a collaborative agreement to restore the USS LUCID was established with San Joaquin County Office of Education and SHMM. Now berthed at SJCOE's San Joaquin Building Futures Academy, its students will help with the estimated five-year restoration process. The students will have an opportunity to learn such skills as woodworking, drafting, electrical, plumbing, metal fabrication, wood preservation, and finishing, as well as doing historical research for docent presentations.

Upon return to it's original appearance, the USS LUCID will become a permanent part of the historic downtown waterfront area, near Weber point. It will reside where more than 1,000 ships were built from the 1850's to 1980's as a museum ship, open to the public for tours and special events. She will serve to honor Stockton's maritime and shipbuilding history, the men and women who labored there, and the men who served aboard the small vessels that were such a big part of the US Navy.
